Understanding parts of a sentence

Q: nani o tabemasuka。 Q: なに を たべますか。

A: oishii sushi o tabemasu.

A: おいしい すし を たべます。

QUESTION WORD

Who? What? When? Where? Why? These are all question words! In this example, the question word is **&** which means 'what?'

PARTICLE

Particles help us to link words and they also ensure that our sentences make sense! In this example, there are two: (th and th). th is like a question mark! *\fit{z} is a particle that shows us the object of the sentence.

VERB

Verbs are action words, they often appear at the end of the sentence in Japanese. In this example, the verb is たべます which means 'to eat'.

ADJECTIVE

Adjectives are describing words. They are used to describe nouns. In this example, the adjective is **bull** which means 'delicious'.

OB JECT

The *object* of a sentence is <u>what/who</u> receives the action of the verb! The object in this example is **\$\overline{\pi}\$** which means 'sushi'!
